Advent: Love

[1Co 13:1-13 ESV] 1 If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. 3 If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. 4 Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant 5 or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; 6 it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. 7 Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. 8 Love never ends. As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away. 9 For we know in part and we prophesy in part, 10 but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. 11 When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways. 12 For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known. 13 So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

I. Intro

- A. Recap:
 - 1. Hope: Expectation
 - 2. Peace: Freedom in Christ
 - 3. Joy: cannot be separated from Christ's presence
 - 4. Love: The greatest of these attributes
- B. When we genuinely Love, we demonstrate an attribute of God.
 - 1. Once again, the divine imperative and the divine indicative collide
 - 2. God loves as only he can, and indication of His divine attribute.
 - 3. God tells us to love, by His power, and with His love.
- C. Love words in the NT:
 - 1. Phileo: love for a brother
 - 2. Agape: Love like God
 - Both words are attributes of the Spirit filled life, but today we are focusing on AGAPE
- D. God showed HIS LOVE for humanity in the incarnation, we remember that in the Advent.
- E. The passage for today is an example for us to follow, and a statement of who God is.
 - 1. Passages that set the stage:
 - 2. God is Love:
 - a) [1Jo 4:8 ESV] 8 Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love.
 - b) [1Jo 4:16 ESV] 16 So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him.
 - 3. Perfect Love: [1Jo 4:18 ESV] 18 There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love.
 - 4. Love in Action: [Jhn 3:16 ESV] 16 "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

II. Text

- A. Read 1 Corinthians 13
- B. Verses 1-3:
 - 1. This is directed to instruct us of how to act/react
 - 2. We are to possess this attribute of love as an example of Christ in us.
- C. Verses 4-8:
 - 1. Christ was an example for each of these attributes

- 2. His example is for us to follow.
- ALL OF US

D. Verses 9-13

- 1. Right now, we are in an imperfect place, in an imperfect battle with our flesh
- 2. There will be a day when it all becomes clear
- 3. There will be a day of perfection
- 4. This is the promise of LOVE in action, it will have immediate effect, yet will never end and be experienced in perfection.

III. Points

A. Love God

- 1. The simplest of commands, but the most profound
- 2. Love God, this is seen in the 10 commandments and in the restating of the 10 commandments with Jesus in the gospels.
- 3. Our journey starts with Love
 - a) But the Love does not start in us, but in God
 - b) Then we come around eventually, but embrace this truth
 - c) We Love God, His Holiness, His work
 - d) We Love God! Though, our flesh is a war with this truth!
- 4. How is your flesh at war with this truth?
 - a) Lack of Trust
 - b) Lack of obedience
 - c) Lack of acknowledgment
 - d) Selfishness!
- 5. Selfishness is the enemy of the Advent
 - a) When we focus on self rather than rely on God
 - b) When we tell God "We've got this" rather than trust in Him and what He has done
 - c) When our hope is in something other than the incarnation
 - d) When our peace is a counterfeit
 - e) When our joy is separated from Jesus
 - f) When we love self more than we Love God.

B. Love Like God

- 1. 1 Corinthians 13 is an example of Christian Love found in the person of Christ
- 2. He did this, and we shall as well.
- 3. How would your world look different if you LOVED LIKE GOD?
 - a) Unconditional?
 - b) With GRACE?
- 4. How would you impact the world with your life?
 - a) You would be marked
 - b) You would demonstrate truth...the whole truth...Grace and Truth
- 5. What needs to change?

C. Love of God

- 1. You are loved by God
- 2. That will never change
- 3. There is no place you go, no deed you've done, not thought you think that is past the redemptive love of God!
- 4. You are chosen, and forgiveness is available for you.

IV. Close

- A. Love people enough to share truth and life with them
- B. Love God enough to invite Him into the areas you have walled off
- C. Allow transformation to continue in you
