## Steadfast

[Jas 1:1-4 ESV] 1 James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes in the Dispersion: Greetings.

2 Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, 3 for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. 4 And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.

#### I. Intro

- A. Recap last sermon:
  - 1. Bondslave
  - 2. Rejoice
- B. This week: STAY STRONG
- C. Count it joy, and grow in the spot you are planted!
- D. Steadfast is not the most exciting of the charges (divine imperatives) from God, yet its truly powerful:
  - 1. Worship...active participation
  - 2. Fight the Good Fight...we are geared up for battle, lets get to it
  - 3. Be steadfast...ok...but what do I do???
- E. Steadfastness is not inactivity, but continued activity from previous instruction

#### II. Text

- A. Rejoice
- B. James is written in a fashion that introduces truth, and then digs deeper in a spiral form that keeps hitting a little deeper as we move through the letter
  - 1. Trials, Wisdom, Wealth, Works
- C. Count it Joy when you have trials
  - 1. When you are going through trials, there is joy to be found
  - 2. God has not left you abandoned
- D. Testing of your faith produces steadfastness
  - 1. Steadfast: hypomonē: from word for UNDER and word for ABIDE
  - 2. Hypo is an interesting prefix:
    - a) Refers to position, but seems to bring more impact
    - b) Seems also to refer to a willful choice of position, so steadfast is not just abide, but choose to remain in an abiding relationship
  - 3. The things that Test our faith cause us to remain in the abide
  - 4. Webster: steadfast \STED-fast\ adjective. 1 a : firmly fixed in place : immovable. b : not subject to change. 2 : firm in belief, determination, or adherence : loyal.
- E. Steadfast in full effect:
  - 1. The Full outcome of steadfastness is Christ's presence
  - 2. Perfect and complete
    - a) You are perfect and complete because of Christ
    - b) The result of that is a life that chooses to abide in relationship.
    - c) The choice is such that you would not make the choice without relationship with Christ.
  - 3. Lacking nothing
    - a) You are equipped
    - b) You lack nothing because He is the one that holds it all together.

#### III. Point

- A. Steadfast in Trials
  - 1. There are challenges all around, some are long lasting...trials
  - 2. Things that are not super exciting or glamorous:
    - a) Steadfastness
    - b) Trials and Testings

### 3. We need to celebrate STEADFASTNESS!

- 4. Trials: testing do to circumstances that could hinder
- 5. [Gal 4:12-16 ESV] 12 Brothers, I entreat you, become as I am, for I also have become as you are. You did me no wrong. 13 You know it was because of a bodily ailment that I preached the gospel to you at first, 14 and though my condition was a trial to you, you did not scorn or despise me, but received me as an angel of God, as Christ Jesus. 15 What then has become of your blessedness? For I testify to you that, if possible, you would have gouged out your eyes and given them to me. 16 Have I then become your enemy by telling you the truth?
- 6. [2Co 12:7-10 ESV] 7 So to keep me from becoming conceited because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from becoming conceited. 8 Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me. 9 But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. 10 For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong.
- 7. Paul dealt with trials:
  - a) He asked for the testing to go away
  - b) But found contentment in his opportunity to rely on Christ
  - c) He dealt with it in the same way we should...ask God to make it go away, but find joy in the midst of hardship.
- 8. Count your blessings, be positive, find Joy, proclaim Joy, and realize you are being given an opportunity to GROW.
- B. Steadfast in Testimony
  - 1. How you respond to the trial and testing will give a testimony to everyone.

# 2. Through a TEST, you develop a TESTIMONY

- 3. ILL: Some of the best stories come from hard situations
  - a) Camping...storm comes...tent leaks...stories for years
  - b) 4X4 mudding...buddies say send it...you send it...get stuck...spend hours digging out...stories for years
  - c) Trials...endure the challenge...learn to wait on God...watch Him deliver at the right time...stories for eternity.
- 4. We are going to have trials, and we will also have testimony that will impact others
- 5. We live in a fallen world, and that world needs to know how God can work in the midst of challenge.
- C. Steadfast in Triumph
  - 1. Victory can come in the midst of Darkness
  - 2. A hard fought victory is one that ends in joy, but is full of challenges along the way.
  - 3. During the contest:
    - a) There will be ups and downs
    - b) There will be mistakes and amazing performances
    - c) There will be uncertainty and confidence
    - d) But in the end, after the victory is won, there will be celebration
    - e) All the missed calls, missed shots, missed opportunities will not be as important, the victory has been won.
  - 4. Let God WIN the TRIUMPH
    - a) God will fight for you
    - b) God will be your defense
    - c) God will be your strength

- d) God will be your encouragere) God will be the one that challenges you as well
